GOSPEL – Luke 6, 17. 20-26

He came down with them and stood on the level place, with a great crowd of his disciples and a great multitude of people from all Judea, Jerusalem, and the coast pf Tyre and Sidon. Then he looked up at his disciples and said: "Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the Kingdom of God. "Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be satisfied. "Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh. "Blessed are you when people hate you, when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the son of Man. Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, surely your reward is great in heaven: For that is what their ancestors did to the prophets. "But woe to you who are the rich, for you have received your consolation. "Woe to you who are full now, for you will be hungry. "Woe to those who are laughing now, for you will mourn and weep. "Woe to you when all men speak well of you, for that is what their ancestors did to the false prophets."

We deepen the Gospel

Today in the first reading, the book of Jeremiah draws our attention: do not put your trust in yourselves or in your wealth. Lean only on God. The Gospel of the Beatitudes goes much further: Blessed are the poor; place all your trust in God, He will fill you with richness. Word that means: "soon you will be envied" It is necessary to know that the multitude that followed Jesus was not formed by socially influential and important people. He is reproached for establishing relations with anyone. On the other hand the word "poor" in the Old Testament has nothing to do with a bank account: the "poor" in the biblical sense "les anawin" are those who do not have a proud heart or a proud look as the psalm says; they are called "hunched backs" and they are the little ones, the humble ones of the country according to the prophetic language. They are not satiated, satisfied and happy with themselves; they always miss something. Only God can fill them. A true prophet exposes himself to not being to everyone's taste, Jesus knows a lot about this experience. A true prophet does not even have time to think about money to accumulate it or take care of its publicity. Without a doubt, these four Beatitudes of Luke can be applied to Jesus Christ a poor man who did not have a stone to rest his head on and who dies in misery and abandonment; Jesus who wept in mourning his friend Lazarus and who knew the anguish of the Garden of Olives; Jesus who wept over the misfortune of Jerusalem, who knew hunger and thirst from the desert to the cross. Jesus who was despised, slandered, persecuted, suppressed in the name of good principles and true

religion. If we stop to reflect on it, we can conclude by saying, It is the last straw.

Somehow proclaiming happy are those who live the Beatitudes, beginning with himself. Jesus gives thanks because he knows the quality of the look of love with which the Father surrounds him. He also knows that victory has been achieved since the promise of the resurrection is outlined in the Beatitudes. Jesus reveals to us this gaze of God, this mercy of God. Etymologically speaking, the word "mercy" means inward that vibrate. This is what this text wants to tell us today: there is the gaze of man, there is the gaze of God. On the other hand, the opposition between blessings and curses does not divide humanity into two different groups: those who deserve these comforting words and those who do not deserve them. We are all part of each other and the most beautiful thing is that Jesus Christ tells each one of us: "Let's go."

- 1. What does the text says? (Reading)
- 2. What is God telling me through this text? (Meditation)
- 3. How do I dialogue with God with what the text tells me? (Prayer)
- 4. How do I feel the presence of God in my life? (Contemplation)
- 5. How do I put into practice the message of the word of God in my real life? (Action)
