GOSPEL - Luke 12, 32-48

«Do not be afraid, little flock, because your Father has seen fit to give you the Kingdom. "Sell your possessions and give alms. Make purses for yourselves that do not wear out, an unfailing treasure in heaven, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. "Let your loins be girded and your lamps lit, and be like men who wait for their master to return from the wedding, so that, as soon as he arrives and knocks, they will immediately open for him. Blessed are the servants that the master when he comes finds them awake: I assure you that he will gird himself, make them sit at table and, going from one to another, will serve them. Let him come in the second watch or in the third, if he finds them like this, lucky them! Understand this well: if the owner of the house knew at what time the thief was going to come, he would not let them break into his house. You too be ready, because the moment you do not think, the Son of man will come." Peter said "Lord, do you tell this parable for us or for everyone?" The Lord replied: "Who then is the faithful and prudent administrator whom the master will put in charge of his servants to give them their proper portion at the proper time? Blessed is that servant whom his lord, upon arrival, finds doing so. Truly I tell you that he will put him in charge of all his property. But if that servant says in his heart, "My lord is slow to come," and begins to beat the male and female servants, to eat and drink and to get drunk, the lord of that servant will come on a day when he does not expect and in the moment he does not know, will separate him and point out his fate among the infidels. "That servant who, knowing the will of his master, has not prepared anything or acted according to his will, will receive many stripes; he who does not know her and does things worthy of whipping, will receive few; to whom much was given, much will be demanded; and from whom much is entrusted, more will be asked"

We deepen the Góspel

"Do not be afraid, little flock, because your Father has considered that it is good to entrust the Kingdom to you. Let us translate as: The Kingdom is certainly yours; believe in it even if appearances deceive. It is the reason why we can affirm, every Sunday: "we await the joy that God promises and that consists in the coming of Jesus Christ our Saviour."

But Jesus does not stop here, Jesus quickly describes the demands that arises from this fact and that we are called to assume. From whom everyone to whom much has been given, much will be required; and from whom the one to whom much has been entrusted, even more will be

demanded." God entrusts us every day that the realization of his project advances. To us to live up to the trust that God makes us.

Henceforth, we should have only one thing in our minds, the fulfilment of God's promise, and this begins by freeing us from other concerns: "Sell what you have and give to the poor. Make purses for yourself that do not wear out, an unfailing treasure in heavens, there where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be." Then Jesus details what he expects from us and makes it an image with the help of three small parables: the first is the parable of the servants who wait for their master; the second, shorter, compares his return to the unexpected arrival of a thief; As for the third, Jesus describes in it the arrival of the chief and the judgment that he is going to carry out on the behaviour of his servants.

The key word here is the word service: God honours us when he makes us his servants and collaborators. Every Sunday, the Lord invites us to his table and gives us the necessary food. In this way we rebuild our strength to continue serving.
