GOSPEL - Mark 6, 7

"Calling the Twelve to Him, He began to send them two by two and gave them authority over impure spirits. These were the instructions: "Take nothing for the journey except a staff- no bread, no bag, no money in your belts, Wear sandals but not an extra shirt. Whenever you enter a house, stay there until you leave that town. And if any place will not welcome you or listen to you, leave that place and shake the dust off your feet as a testimony against them". They went out and preached that people should repent. They drove out many demons and anointed many sick people with oil and healed them."

Deepening the Gospel:

Here are the Twelve at the beginning of their missionary action: without any doubt, Jesus had conceived the project of sending them, since, from the third chapter of his Gospel, Mark tells us that Jesus had chosen them with that intention: «Jesus climbs the mountain and calls those he wanted. They came to Him and Jesus established twelve of them to be with Him and to send them out to preach with the power to cast out demons. In today's Gospel, we see how Jesus sends them, bestowing on them the power to cast out demons. «Jesus calls the Twelve and sends them for first time, He gives them power over the evil spirits. » At the same time, He gives them three commands: To go two by two, not to carry more than what is needed, and not to be impressed by the unavoidable persecution.

First, to go two by two: this seems to be a common practice in Jesus. Mark gives us some examples: to prepare for the entry into Jerusalem: «Jesus sends two of his disciples and tells them: 'Go to the next town ... you will find a tied donkey there ...The same to prepare the Passover: « Jesus sends two of his disciples and tells them: 'Go into the city, and a man carrying a jar of water will meet you...». It may be that in this way of proceeding there is a sign of the Jewish custom according to which a testimony was not valid until it is testify by at least two witnesses: (Dt .19:15). Evangelization is also a matter of witnessing; it is not an individual matter. Peter and John also go together to the Temple in Jerusalem (Acts 13-15); after the separation, Paul continues the mission with Silas (Acts 16-17). Second, take nothing more than what is strictly necessary: their only instruments should be

those needed to go to the mission. Hearing this command, the apostles probably evoked the exodus of their Fathers in faith, on the night of the famous Passover, "the belt on the kidneys, the sandals on the feet, the staff in the hand. »

Third command given by Jesus: do not be impressed by the inevitable persecution. According to Mark's Gospel, the apostles have just witnessed the failure of Jesus in Nazareth (6, 1-6).

It is as if persecution were always the lot of preachers and prophets: the first reading gives us a clear example with Amos, dispatched from where he was after a few months of preaching. Stiff neck? »Hardened heart? For these bad reasons, Jesus was crucified and afterwards, many others martyred.

Fortunately, the apostles did not find only hostility and hardened hearts. The proof? The irresistible growth of Christian communities after the Resurrection of Christ.

Keys for prayer:

- 1. Visualize the scene, sit down close to the disciples. Do you feel called by Jesus?
- 2. What is he calling you for?
- 3. How do you live persecution as a result of following Him?
