FREEDOM IS BORN FROM CHARITY







MOTIVATION

Freedom is the most precious Gift that we have received, it is a Gift from God that magnifies man, since it places him on the level of the personal relationship with God, realizes him as a "person", calls him to be a son. But, above all, this gift speaks of the greatness of God, who opens a door to Him by giving Him freedom. That is why it must be received as a gift that moves one to gratitude.

Freedom is a Right inherent to human beings, without any exception and without distinction by age, race, sex, social condition or other characteristics; as established in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. It establishes that fundamental human rights must be protected throughout the world, and among these rights is freedom. As article 1 of this declaration states: "All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights and, endowed as they are with reason and conscience, they must behave fraternally towards one another."

Throughout history there have been terrible events that have denigrated freedom, such as the slavery of thousands of people on five continents, totalitarian governments that restrict freedom of expression and information...

What is the Liberty?

The REA defines it as the "natural faculty that man has to act in one way or another, and not to act, for which he is responsible for his actions."

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There are individual freedoms: Freedom of thought, Freedom of opinion and expression, Freedom of movement and Freedom of ethical convictions, conscience and religion; and collective freedoms: Freedom of association, Freedom of association, Freedom of peaceful assembly and Freedom of demonstration.

"Everything can be taken from a man except one thing, the last of human freedoms, the ability to choose one's personal attitude in the face of a set of circumstances. This is spiritual freedom, which cannot be taken away from us. That spiritual freedom is what makes life have meaning and purpose. "Whoever lost faith in the future, in his future, was doomed," writes Viktor Frankl in his book: Man's Search for Meaning.

Inner freedom means being more masters of our inner world, being less influenced by the circumstances of the outside world, having greater control of our reactions and emotions, being stronger and less vulnerable to criticism, failures, and the opinions of others. It is maintaining our integrity, our dignity, our acceptance, our self-respect and self-esteem above the circumstances, it gives us lordship over ourselves and others.

Therefore, considering freedom as a great Value that guides human actions towards respect and integrity, we must take care of and protect it as a treasure that favors full personal development, lays the foundations for happiness and allows us to build societies in which people and groups express themselves, organize and participate, without fear of being violated.



BIBLICAL ILLUMINATION

Since the beginning of salvation history, God has manifested himself to human beings as the liberating God. From the freedom granted to our first parents to choose between good and evil, to the liberating action that occurred when we left slavery in Egypt. God shows himself to his creatures as their Savior, who out of love establishes an Alliance with them that is a sign of liberation. Let us remember that the tables of the law did not represent an oppressive yoke for the People, but rather the liberating path from their own selfishness and sin that distanced them from their God and their brother.

We also remember how God, freeing the people from the slavery of Egypt, led them through signs and wonders towards the land of promise, the land of freedom. We know well that the People of Israel initially embraced the freedom that God offered them, but on many occasions, they remembered the onions of Egypt, murmured against God and longed for the times of oppression under Pharaoh. And we must keep in mind that the conquest of Freedom is not easy, it requires effort, tenacity, perseverance and faith in the God of promise.

A promise that reaches its full fulfillment in Christ. He paid the high price for our freedom by defeating, with the surrender of his life, the slavery of sin in us. The key is love. For this we can affirm that freedom is born from love, **born from Charity**.

We will recite with a grateful attitude to two choirs, various biblical texts that tell us about this freedom granted by God through Christ the Lord, interspersing the following chorus:

But now that you have been freed from sin and made servants of God, your fruit is sanctification, and as an end, eternal life. (Romans 6:22)

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, Because he has anointed me to give good news to the poor; He has sent me to heal the brokenhearted; To proclaim freedom to the captives,

And sight to the blind; To set the oppressed free . (Luke 4:18)

But he who looks attentively into the perfect law, that of freedom , and perseveres in it, not being a forgetful hearer, but a doer of the work, he will be blessed in what he does. (James 1:25)

The freedom of the Spirit is born from Charity

You who love Jehovah, hate evil; He guards the souls of his saints; He delivers them from the hand of the wicked. (Psalm 97:10)

The freedom of the Spirit is born from Charity

Help us, O God of our salvation, for the glory of your name; And deliver us, and forgive us our sins for the sake of your name. (Psalm 79:9)
