### GOSPEL – Luke 1, 1-4; 4, 14-21

"Since many have attempted to narrate in an orderly manner the things that have taken place among us, as they have been transmitted to us by those who from the beginning were eyewitnesses and servants of the Word, I have also decided, after having diligently investigated everything from the origins, write it to you in order, illustrious Theophilus, so that you know the solidity of the teachings you have received. "Jesus returned to Galilee by the power of the Spirit, and his fame spread throughout the region. He was teaching in their synagogues, praised by all. He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up, and, according to his custom, he entered the synagogue on the Sabbath day, and stood up to read. They gave him the volume of the prophet Isaiah and unrolling the volume, he found the passage where it was written: The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to announce the Good News to the poor, he has sent me to proclaim liberation to the captives and sight to the blind, to give freedom to the oppressed and to proclaim a year of favour from the Lord. Rolling up the volume he returned it to the minister, and sat down. In the synagogue all eyes were fixed on him. So he began to say to them: "This Scripture, which you have just heard, has been fulfilled today."

**Nehemiah 8, 1-4a5.6.8-10.** The text places us before a great liturgy of the Word: an assembly of all the people; solemn enthronement of the Book; reader well in sight; translation into the common language and its explanation.

Psalm 18. Life and wisdom, joy and clarity, righteousness and justice, security: unspeakable are the benefits that come from the Word of God.

**1 Corinthians 12, 12-30.** "The Church, the body of Christ of which we are members." It is essential that each one correctly perform their own function. In their diversity, they all contribute to the good and harmonious functioning of the whole. Neither should be considered inferior to the other.

Luke 1, 1-4; 4, 14-21. The story we read today takes place after the baptism of Jesus. Apparently, everything was going well for the new preacher. He taught in the synagogues of the Jews, and everyone praised him. That morning seemed to announce itself positively: Jesus is a good Jew and, like everyone else, about tomorrow he is going to the synagogue to participate in the service. It is not strange either that a reading is entrusted to him since every believer has the right to read the Scriptures. The celebration in the synagogue then develops normally... right up to the moment when Jesus reads that text from Isaiah so well known to everyone and, in the midst of a fervent silence, which follows the reading, Jesus calmly affirms an enormity: "This "The word that you have just heard has been fulfilled today." In other words, when Jesus affirms: "The word of Isaiah that I just read: 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because the Lord has consecrated me with the anointing'... has been fulfilled in me today." Jesus says, simply "I am the Messiah you wait for." "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me... He has sent me to announce the Good News to the poor... Here is the work of the Spirit. Sometimes we look for criteria of discernment, right? Well, in this program we are well served, because what is said here about Christ is valid for all of us who are confirmed, to the extent of our smallness of course.
